


DR. VALERIO FARAONI

NATURAL SCIENCES AND MATHEMATICS

To improve the world you must understand it first.

The solutions for many of the challenges we face in the 21st century such as global warming, genetic engineering, food production and the search for alternative energy sources are rooted in the investigations of science. Studying science at Bishop's means direct access to your professors, research opportunities beginning in first year, and plenty of summer research assistant positions. Fully renovated laboratories equipped with excellent scientific equipment promote our commitment to hands-on learning.

Our science students go on to graduate studies and careers in cutting-edge fields such as Health Science, Environmental and Forensic Science, Robotics, Astrophysics, Digital Imaging, and Smart Technologies Development. We are looking for passionate students interested in advancing human understanding of the world we live in. If this sounds like you, keep reading.

BIOCHEMISTRY

Master the fundamentals of experimental biochemistry. Well-equipped laboratory facilities, first-hand experience with state-of-the-art equipment, and close instructional contact with professors are key to the success of this program. Challenge yourself in courses such as animal physiology, microbiology, immunology, and psychopharmacology.

BIOLOGY

Hike or canoe to undertake field work in local bogs, lakes, rivers, mountains, marshes, hardwood forests and meadows. Bring what you learn to modern laboratory facilities including an athletic performance lab, aquatic and terrestrial animal rooms, a greenhouse, growth chambers, incubators or centrifuges. Choose to specialize in Health Science or Biodiversity & Ecology. Let us prepare you for graduate work and careers in exciting fields such as medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine, physiotherapy, athletic therapy, or wildlife biology.

CHEMISTRY

One-on-one learning with supportive and innovative faculty is a cornerstone of the Chemistry department. This program will provide you with an excellent education in all disciplines of Chemistry – Analytical, Biochemistry, Environmental, Inorganic, Organic, and Physical Chemistry. Opportunities for undergraduate

students to get involved in research are abundant and the majority of our Honours graduates go on to further their studies, in programs such as Medicine, Dentistry, and Pharmacy.

COMPUTER SCIENCE AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

You will be hard-pressed to find a walk of life where Computer Science expertise is not required. The arts, sciences, business, government, and education sectors are fuelled by developments in Computer Science and Information Technology. Our Information Technology program allows you to combine your Computer Science studies with a specialization in Business. Students work on campus for our IT Help Desk, receive funding to attend conferences, and get a head start on their career through our Co-Op program.


PRE-MEDICINE DOUBLE MAJOR

Studying Business Administration at Bishop's means a hands-on, experiential business education. Solve real-life marketing dilemmas, devise innovative solutions for local companies and start building your own business network, all while studying in the Williams School of Business. Our case-format courses and seminars as well as our interactive classroom settings provide a unique opportunity for students to discover their strengths and transform their weaknesses as they hone their presentation and writing skills in a supportive learning environment.

Students may work toward either a Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) or a Bachelor of Arts with a major in Business (B.A.). The B.B.A. program provides a solid foundation in core business subjects but also allows students to gain specialized knowledge in one of seven business concentrations. The B.A. program provides the same foundation in core business subjects but allows students the flexibility to combine their business studies with a major or minor in another field.

GENERAL BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

Students will specialize in a broad range of traditional business functions such as research methods, change management, interpersonal skills, innovation and entrepreneurship.

ACCOUNTING

Learn how companies, investors and governments compile, present, and use financial information. Courses such as managerial accounting, taxation and auditing prepare you to become a professional accountant and provide the basis for a variety of other business designations (C.I.M., C.B.I., etc.).

ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Understand the entrepreneurial process required to turn an innovative idea into a new business venture - a skill set with tremendous value in the job market. Gain hands-on experience with local entrepreneurs through the Dobson-Lagassé Entrepreneurship Centre on campus.

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS

explains Dr. Michele Murray, professor of Religion and Dean of Arts and Science. "While I was working on my Master's degree in Jewish history, becoming a professor in a university wasn't on my radar. I actually took a break half way through my degree to pursue training as a commercial pilot. I realized towards the end of that training that I had reached a point where I would master the crucial aspects of flying. The times that would be exciting, would be emergencies—times you don't want. I learned something really important about myself. I didn't want to arrive—I wanted to always be learning. I feel that I am always learning from my students. It's a joint effort in the classroom. Students come with perspectives and insights that have never occurred to me. I love how my students are always stimulating me to look at something in a different way."

As an industrial organizational psychologist, Business professor Dr. Michael Teed loves to share his passion for human behaviour in the workplace. "Bishop's is a place where the classroom is only five rows deep. So when I introduce a theoretical perspective on something like leadership, the intimate environment really supports discussion." Dr. Teed's newest initiative is harnessing this classroom setting as an opportunity for group learning with real-world, practical implications. "One of the things student face when they leave university and start looking for work is the demand for work experience. I knew this was a stressor and started to think about ways I could address it in the classroom. I've been working on a model to train students in résumé writing and interview coaching, as well as HR consultation for small businesses. They will then offer these services to members of the community. It's a great exercise in experiential learning."



Educating Teachers and Inspiring Minds.

We are educating the world's next generation of teachers to deliver knowledge using the latest methods and technologies. At Bishop's we emphasize teaching as an intellectual pursuit and as a career with a great deal of social responsibility. Combine hands-on, real world experience with challenging and stimulating coursework in subjects such as linguistic diversity, multicultural education, and individual differences to prepare yourself to teach around the globe.

Our concurrent education program boasts over 700 hours spent practice teaching in elementary and secondary schools. This practical application begins in your first semester. Students choose either an Elementary Education Profile, or a Secondary Education Profile, and earn a B.A. or B.Sc. as well as a B.Ed.
